PROCEEDINGS OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN TOWN OF GRAMERCY JANUARY 11, 2021

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Gramercy, Louisiana, met in regular, monthly session on Monday, January 11, 20201 at 7:04 pm at Gramercy Town Hall.

Mayor Nosacka called the meeting to order, and asked that the Clerk call roll:

PRESENTATION AND COMMENTS - None

REPORTS

1. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Nosacka handed out a year to date report on sales tax and video poker. Toys for Tots was at the fire station in December and donated toys to over 330 children. Mr. Bobby Faucheux is reviewing the 4H Cooperative Endeavor Agreement for use of the fire station. He has received two quotes for grass cutting in the town and is waiting for one more quote to be submitted.

2. REPORT ON-GOING PROJECT

Mayor Nosacka reported that Atmos Energy recommends a new 2" gas line be installed for proper gas supply to the new generator at Dudley Pump Station. Mayor Nosacka will meet with St. James Parish Operations Director Rick Weber to review plans for parish assistance on the S. Millet drainage and widening project.

REPORTS OF DEPARTMENT HEADS AND DIRECTORS

A. REPORT FROM CHIEF OF POLICE

Chief Dicharry reported that the Christmas and New Year Holidays were quiet and the were no incidents to report for December.

REPORT FROM EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Lt. Jody Ordeneaux stated that he continues to monitor Covid-19 information that he receives from LA Department of Health. South Star Urgent Care has been designated as a Covid Immunization location for St. James Parish.

B. REPORT FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

Code Enforcement Officer Ronald Boudreaux reported that vehicle letters were sent in November and the 90-day timeline will be up in February. A second letter giving 10 days to remove the vehicle will be sent at that time.

3. REPORTS FROM ST. JAMES PARISH GOVERNMENT

District 1 Councilman Alvin St. Pierre Jr. handed out his 2021 Parish budget report for District 1. Projects budgeted include the Central Canal bulkhead from 2nd Street to 4th Street, several projects for Gramercy Recreation, purchase culverts for Rose Street drainage improvements, purchase and install culverts on S. Millet drainage and widening project, and Capital Outlay money for improvements to the East Bank Multipurpose Building.

4. REPORTS FROM BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

A. PLANNING COMMISSION

Planning Commission Chairman Barry LeBlanc reported that the Planning Commission will begin reviewing permit prices at the February meeting.

B. GRAMERCY RECREATION DISTRICT

Mr. Craig Calcagno stated there was no meeting in December.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Alderman Louque, second by Alderman Calcagno and approved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, and to adopt the minutes as published.

PAYMENT OF BILLS/FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

It was moved by Alderman Wiggins, second by Alderman Woods, and approved to pay all bills and accept financial statements presented before the Council.

ALDERMEN'S REPORT

Alderman Brack had no report for this month.

Alderman Louque reported the area on N. Airline from railroad tracks to Airline Highway needs to be cleaned.

Alderman Woods thanked the town workers for repairing the water leak on Rose Street.

Mayor Nosacka stated that he received a letter thanking the Maintenance workers for the water tap installation on a new construction. The property owner was pleased with their professionalism and patience during this process.

Alderman Calcagno passed out his monthly report. He reported that the ditch on Second Street to Central Canal needs to be cleaned. The cross-cut canal cleaning by Gramercy Elementary needs to be completed to help with drainage. He researched prices for a truck mounted fuel tank, and he will forward this information to Mayor Nosacka.

Alderman Wiggins reported that he has six houses that need to be considered for demolition and he will turn in a street light outage list to the office.

TOWN ATTORNEY

Mr. Faucheux reported the Rise St. James lawsuit is still pending. He will review the contract for the 4H Cooperative Endeavor Agreement.

There being no further business it was moved by Alderman Calcagno, second by Alderman Wiggins, and approved to adjourn at 7:58 pm.
