PROCEEDINGS OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN TOWN OF GRAMERCY MARCH 14, 2022

PUBLIC HEARING:

To receive public comments regarding a request by Theron Louque, 724 N Millet, for a special exception to the Town of Gramercy Zoning Ordinance and to provide for related matters.

There were no oral or written comments on the request.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Gramercy, Louisiana, met in regular, monthly session on Monday, March 14, 2022 at 6:00 pm at Gramercy Town Hall.

Mayor Nosacka called the meeting to order, and asked the Clerk to call roll:

PRESENTATION AND COMMENTS - None

REPORTS

1. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Nosacka stated that the redistricting ordinance introduction is planned for the April meeting. The sales taxes are recovering mostly due to Winn Dixie's reopening. He attended the "Stop the Violence" Prayer Breakfast last Friday, along with local community & industry leaders. Ag Day at Fast Food Farms is set for April 6, 4022. He as begun to assemble a steering committee for the Main Street Enhancement Program and researching if State assistance is available. Sewer line repairs on N. Ezidore and N. Montz have been completed.

2. REPORT ON-GOING PROJECT

Mayor Nosacka reported that we are waiting on the contractor's scheduling to begin asphalt street repairs. Scott Poirrier, High Tide Consultants, updated the council on the South Millet widening project and Central Canal shoring project. The RFQ has been issued for the N Ezidore Circle Drain Culvert Project. The contractor is preparing a proposal for lighting replacement on US 61. An engineer completed a site visit for the light project on LA 3125 and will prepare initial submission to the Council. The advertising for Townowned buildings roof replacements will be in this weeks News Examiner. Engineering is in process for the Dudley Force Main replacement project.

REPORTS OF DEPARTMENT HEADS AND DIRECTORS

A. REPORT FROM CHIEF OF POLICE

Chief Dicharry reported that there were no incidences in Gramercy during the Mardi Gras parade. The police department will be advertising for a full-time officer.

B. REPORT FROM EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

There was no report for this month.

C. REPORT FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

Code Enforcement Officer Alex Gerhold passed out a monthly report on the number of inoperable vehicles in Town. He has begun to notice the owners and will update the board on the progress in coming months.

<u>ORDINANCE NO. 737-2022 AN ORDIANCE AMENDING THE TOWN OF GRAMERCY CODE OF ORIDNANCES, CHAPTER 46, SECTION 46.4, MANUFACTURED HOUSING AND MOBILE HOME STANDARDS</u>

RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION NO. 11-2022

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWN CLERK TO OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT ENTITLED SPECIAL REVENUES ACCOUNT AT FIRST AMERICAN BANK

WHEREAS, the funds from the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds program, a part of the American Rescue Plan, must be held separately from other funds;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the Town of Gramercy, Louisiana, that First American Bank (herein called the "Depository") is hereby designated as a legal depositary of money belonging to the Town of Gramercy, and that said money belonging to the Town of Gramercy, shall be deposited in said bank from time to time in the name of said Town, and that monies so deposited may be withdrawn upon a check, draft, note or order of the town.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that checks drawn on the bank account of the Town of Gramercy shall require signatures.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following are hereby authorized to sign said checks effective March 14, 2022.

Whose signatures shall be duly certified to said Depository, and that no checks, drafts, or orders drawn against said Depository shall be valid unless so signed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Depository is hereby authorized and directed to honor and pay any checks, notes or orders so drawn, whether such checks, drafts notes or orders be payable to the order of any such person signing and/or countersigning said checks, drafts, notes or orders, or any of such persons in their individual capacities or not, and whether such checks, drafts, notes or orders are deposited to the individual credit of the person so signing and/or countersigning said checks, drafts, notes or orders, or to the individual credit of any of the other officers or not. This resolution shall continue in force and said Depository may consider the facts the holders of said officers, respectively, and their signatures to be and continue as set forth in the certificate of the Town Clerk, accompanying a copy of this resolution when delivered to said Depository or in any similar subsequent certificate, until written notice to the contrary is duly served on said Depository.

RESOLUTION NO. 12-2022

A Resolution approving a special exception of Appendix A Zoning, Article 18, R-1 Residential District, Section 18.4 Area Regulations to allow for the variance of the minimum 5 feet distance requirement

WHEREAS, Mr. Theron Louque has requested a special exception to the zoning ordinance of a certain property located in the corporate limits of the Town of Gramercy, Louisiana, be changed; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing shall be held on the requested zoning area regulation variance on March 14, 2022, 6:00 pm,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Gramercy, Louisiana, that:

SECTION I. A special exception of Appendix A Zoning, Article 18 R-1 Residential District, Section 18.4 Area Regulations is hereby granted allowing for the variance of the minimum 5 feet distance requirement on the following described property.

THAT CERTAIN PORTION at N. 27' of Lot 3, all of lot 4, south 37' of lot 5, Blk. 28, Gramercy Park S/D, Add. 2, 140 x 192, Book 337-392, 724 N Millet, Gramercy, Louisiana.

WHEREAS, the Town of Gramercy (the "Town") has identified the need for engineering and project implementation services related to requirements improvements along Central Canal, between 2nd and 4th Streets.

ALDERMEN'S REPORT

Alderman Calcagno turned in his monthly report. Alderman Calcagno stated that our Mobile Home Ordinance needs updating in several areas. He congratulated Code Enforcement Officer Alex Gerhold on his new position as Code Enforcement Officer. He and Alderman Wiggins continue to survey streetlights and forward any outages to Entergy. He thanked Entergy for their continued efforts in getting the lights repaired in a timely manner.

Alderman Wiggins thanked Alderman Calcagno for his continued help with streetlight surveys. He congratulated Alex Gerhold on his Code Enforcement position.

Alderman Woods stated she received several calls about trees along N. Airline Avenue blocking the view by First American Bank exit. Mayor Nosacka stated they have been removed. She thanked Jim Zeringue for help with demolishing old house in Golden Grove area. The Mardi Gras parade was successful, and all had a nice day.

Alderman Louque congratulated Alex Gerhold on Code Enforcement Officer position. Central Canal needs to be dug to drain standing water. He asked Mayor Nosacka to look into having shrubs or planters on Main Street.

Alderman Brack had no report for this month.

TOWN ATTORNEY

Mr. Faucheux stated that the settlement conference for Rise St. James lawsuit has been rescheduled for May 2, 2022.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A motion was made by Alderman Wiggins, seconded by Alderman Brack to enter into Executive Session to discuss Rise St. James litigation and passed unanimously. A motion to return to the regular meeting was made by Alderman Wiggins, second by Alderman Calcagno and passed unanimously.
