**PUBLIC COMMENTS** – There were no public comments.

### PRESENTATION AND COMMENTS -

Mr. Ryan Donadieu – announce his candidacy for St. James Parish Sheriff in 2023 election.

Mayor Nosacka presented Micah Waguespack with a plaque honoring his Jr. Olympic Gold Medal in Air Rifle Match and Silver Medal in .22 Caliber Smallbore Rifle. Micah thanked his coaches, 4-H Club, family and community for their support.

### **REPORTS**

### 1. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Nosacka reported that Rostand continues to document expenditures and reimbursements to FEMA. The PPDR program currently has 13 applicants. After a seven month delay the water pump for the water plant has been delivered. The DHH Lead and Cooper sample kits have arrived, and we will begin testing soon. The managers from Utz Quality Foods will be here in July to discuss future plans for Zapp's Potato Chips. He has met with Parish Councilman St. Pierre and Operation Director Rick Weber to discuss repairs to Central Canal between 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Streets. The owners of the Mire building have installed fencing around perimeter of the building to prevent intruders and he continues to discuss with them the plans for permanent repairs or demolition.

### 2. REPORT ON-GOING PROJECT

Mayor Nosacka reported that after a delay the resurfacing of S. Mulberry and S. Cherry Streets will continue on June 14<sup>th</sup>. Concrete street repairs will begin in the new Fiscal Year. Alderman Brack suggested getting engineers to review and draw up specifications for

the concrete street repairs. Advanced Utility Services will begin installing our automatic read meters on June 20<sup>th</sup>. Scott Poirrier, High Tide Consultants, has finished the revised plan for the S. Millet project and we will re-bid this project in the near future.

### REPORTS OF DEPARTMENT HEADS AND DIRECTORS

### A. REPORT FROM CHIEF OF POLICE

Chief Dicharry reported that Officer Ballard will retire in July and Officer Preyan has decided to stay with the department. He thanked St. James Parish Sheriff Martin for donating two police units to Gramercy Police Department.

After interviewing applicants for the open position, Chief Dicharry recommended to the Board of Aldermen to hire Mr. Clint Walker. A motion to hire Mr. Clint Walker was made by Alderman Wiggins, seconded by Alderman Brack and the motion passed unanimously.

#### B. REPORT FROM EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Lt. Jody Ordeneaux stated he has spoken with Chief Dicharry and Mayor Nosacka about investigating in less than lethal systems to provide more versatility when responding to various events. Mayor and Board of Alderman express concerns that our officers have the proper protection needed when responding to an active shooter event. He is also working on a sandbag graphic sign so property owners would know how many sandbags are needed to protect their home.

Alderman Brack thanked the Town of Lutcher maintenance crew for helping our maintenance crew with clearing a culvert blockage by China King. He has received complaints about code enforcement, and he will continue to speak with Mayor and Police Chief to help resolve.

### **TOWN ATTORNEY**

Mr. Faucheux stated that the settlement conference for Rise St. James lawsuit has been rescheduled for July 21, 2022.
