PRESENTATION AND COMMENTS

Mayor Nosacka presented a Proclamation honoring Gramercy resident John Earl Abreo on his 100th birthday.

REPORTS

1. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Nosacka stated that the Sales Tax Revenue has increased by 8% of the past year. The mobile home demolition at 243 S Willow Street is near completion. The demolition payment plan at 1583 Tulip has been approved by the family. The family at 1566 Rose Street is considering demolishing the home themselves instead of going through the town. St. James Parish Volunteer Fire Department will hold a Christmas Parade on December 17, 2022; it will include a couple of vehicles and Santa Claus.
